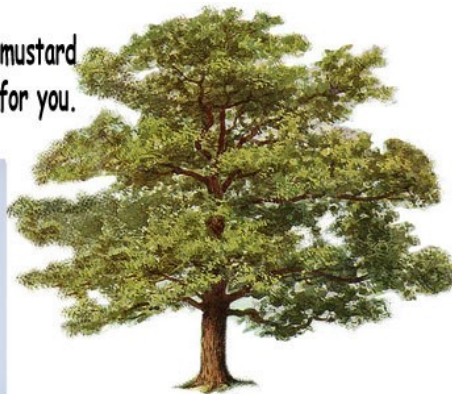

Chaplaincy Council Meeting 8th June

The first meeting of the newly elected council took place on the morning of Saturday 8 June at Chaplaincy House in Estepona. It was a time for the new council to begin its work of helping to support and coordinate the life, ministry and mission of our chaplaincy. We discussed the forthcoming raffle which will take place on 14 July, with tickets drawn in each church. Tickets will be on sale from this Sunday. Matters which are discussed at each council meeting include the administration of safeguarding, environmental concerns, and any issues arising from the report on pastoral and liturgical matters that were previously considered at the Ministry Meeting which takes place on the Tuesday before the council meeting. The occasion of having our first meeting with the new chaplaincy treasurer, Ian Angus, allowed us to discuss the current state of finances in the chaplaincy, as presented in the quarterly accounts provided by our previous treasurer Stephen Wall. In order to strengthen this aspect of the life of the chaplaincy it was suggested that a finance committee, made up of some members from the council, meet with the treasurer prior to each council meeting, so that financial matters can be properly reviewed before the council meeting. Considered financial matters will then be reported to the council for their oversight. As with safeguarding, financial matters, even though administered by a lead person, are the collective responsibility of the chaplaincy council which acts as the 'body corporate' of the chaplaincy. This constitutes the chaplaincy as a recognized legal entity and employer of the chaplain, with overall responsibility for matters of management and maintenance. One of our new members, Chris Wawn, is developing some proposals for the chaplaincy and these will be presented and considered by the council at the next meeting which will take place at Chaplaincy House on the morning of the 14th September. All council meetings begin and end in prayer. **Tony Carroll**

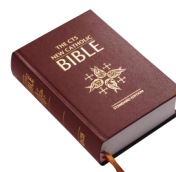
